1 PROPOSAL FROM THE 2 PASADENA CITY COLLEGE FACULTY ASSOCIATION 3 TO THE 4 PASADENA AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT 5 Sept. 15, 2022 6 7 The collective bargaining proposal presented herein by the Pasadena Area Community College 8 District to the Pasadena City College Faculty Association and is expressly made pursuant to the 9 Education Employment Relations Act and the Collective Bargaining Contract between the parties. 10 The following article shall be deemed to remain unchanged in the Collective Bargaining Agreement except as set forth below: 11 12 13 **ARTICLE 16** 14 (NEW) 15 **DISTANCE EDUCATION (Online and Hybrid Classes)** 16 17 16.1 **Definition:** Distance education includes both the Hybrid and Online classes defined by Title 5 where the instructor and student are separated by distance 18 19 and interact through the assistance of technology. For all courses offering 20 online components there shall be regular and effective contact as defined by 21 Section 55204 of Title 5. 22 16.2 Participation by faculty in distance education at Pasadena City College is 23 voluntary. The decision by a faculty member not to be involved with distance 24 education will not be negatively evaluated. 25 26 16.3 **Certification:** All distance education instructors, prior to their first distance 27 education assignment, shall complete training approved by the Distance Education Department or demonstrate mastery or competency in online 28 education. Faculty must maintain certification to teach in online or hybrid 29 30 format. 31 32 Full-time Faculty Load Limitation: A full-time faculty member may be 16.4 33 assigned to teach up to 80% of their contract load each regular primary term 34 (Fall or Spring) assignment as online learning or a combination of online learning and hybrid can be assigned request 80% of their contract load as 35 online classes or a combinaton of online learning and hybrid if online 36 classes are available. If new online classes or hybrid classes are added 37 to the schedule. Deans must assign them according to seniority. 38 39 40 Any deviation from this load limitation must be approved by the Division 41 Dean and the Vice President of Instruction. 42 43 16.5 Virtual Office Hours: All distance education instructors shall conduct virtual 44 office hours. The number of virtual office hours shall be no less than the 45 percentage of the faculty member's contract load that is designated as distance education held in proportion to the professor's distance learning 46 load. Virtual office hours can be conducted from any location. The virtual 47 office hours schedule and the synchronous method of interaction shall be 48 49 communicated to division offices via established division procedures and to

Evaluations shall be conducted under Article 7 - Evaluation Procedures. Prior to the evaluation of a distance education course or online component of a hybrid course the instructor shall be given the opportunity to provide guidance to the administrator/designee and/or peer evaluator regarding course organization and content that is applicable at the time of review. All evaluators may access the online course only at the previously agreed upon days and times stipulated by the instructor. The District shall notify the Faculty Association and the Instructional Faculty unit member of Record of any plan to enter a Distance Education course for

Class size for Distance Learning Classes: The class size limit for a

distance education class shall be the same as for traditional classes (face-to-

Evaluations and Classroom Visitation in Distance Education Courses:

evaluative or disciplinary reasons. Prior knowledge of the entry is a requirement. Such visitors to a faculty member's online course shall be added to the LMS in the "Observer" role.

- **16.7.1** <u>Peer Evaluators</u>: The <u>peer</u> evaluators, who shall be certified in distance education, shall be granted access to the designated course by the Distance Education Department with prior notice to the instructor for a specific period of time. The instructor shall guide the <u>peer</u> evaluators through the course by providing directions, explaining the features of the course, and exploring the course with the evaluators. The peer evaluator shall not have direct online contact with students enrolled in the class. All If possible, peer evaluators must will have taught in the mode/format being evaluated (online or hybrid) within the current year.
- 16.7.2 **Duration:** The evaluation of the course may occur over multiple visits within a seven consecutive day period beginning with the first day of online entry into the course. Follow-up observations may be arranged with the approval of the Division Dean who chairs the evaluation committee. For hybrid courses, the same peer evaluator will observe both the online and face-to-face portions of the course. Access to the online portion will follow the above procedure.
- 16.7.3 **Evaluation Form:** For the evaluated online/hybrid class the evaluator will submit the form approved for use in online/hybrid classes.
