## GENERAL INFORMATION

## Minimum requirements for admission to USC:

1. Intermediate algebra (non-transferable college course), or advanced high school algebra.
2. Lower Division Writing requirement.
3. 30 transferrable units (if less than 30 units, need SAT or ACT)

## USC General Education (GE):

GE requirements include Lower Division Writing, Foreign Language, Core Literacy (Categories A-F), and Global Perspectives (Categories G, H). All majors have the same general education requirements. You do not have to complete USC GE prior to transfer, but it is highly recommended that you do so.

## Pass/No Pass Grading:

- Major preparation courses should be taken for a letter grade.
- No more than 4 units of GE (one course) can be taken pass/no pass.
- The Lower Division Writing course should be taken for a letter grade.
- No more than 24 units total can be taken pass/no pass, including courses taken at USC.
