Peer review resources

You'll find two games -- Episode 1: Giving Feedback and Episode 2: Getting Feedback -- to help you practice peer review skills. Advice on peer review, and exercises to practice three kinds of feedback: believing; doubting; and nutshelling. Use before a peer review assignment or whenever you're asked to give feedback on writing to a friend or colleague.

A new way to visualize working with sources

The animated overview tells the story of a woman who might want a tattoo and how whether to get a tattoo is a kind of research question. She looks into it, discovering that sources: answer questions; are people talking to people; that people agendas; and that they help shape what you think. Tutorials and exercises help bring these insights alive.
