

One Of The Worst Laws-SCA 5

Senate Constitutional Amendment No.5, SCA-5, labeled as "Skin Color Act 5" was protested on February 28th in front of a state office building. Hundreds of Asian Americans expressed their outrage by gathering and appealing against SCA5. In fact, it is completely against the federal law on education, which eventually led it to be rejected by the Republican State Assembly. According to *The LA Times*, on January 30, 2014, "SCA 5 repeals portions of Proposition 209, the 1996 ballot measure prohibiting using race or gender in admission decisions. The California Senate voted to put a constitutional amendment on the November ballot." If SCA 5 passes, all of the California public universities will be allowed to admit students based on their race or gender. As politician Bob Huff said, "This bill allows our public schools to use race and gender to discriminate against students."

We strongly agree with Huff that students should not be judged by their race or gender. Universities should judge students by their merits, their efforts, and their performance. As Martin Luther King said, "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character." The U.S. claims to be a country that has the most freedom and the one that does not tolerate racism. We are so shocked and disappointed that nowadays in the United States we still have these kinds of unfair things happening! While it aims to boost education for Black and Latinos, it deprives the educational rights for hardworking Asian Americans. Such an unthoughtful law would cause two disadvantages to the American higher educational system. One of the cons is that it would hinder the state's educational development, and another is that more Asians will abandon the American



dream. Therefore, this policy has recently been cancelled.

The new proposal SCA5 would hamper the nation's hope in education. We believe that university admission should not be based on racial preferences. Students who study hard and make effort deserve equal opportunity in college admission no matter what race or gender they are. Fairness is important! If a student works harder and gets better grades, he or she should be rewarded to have a chance to go to a better college. According to the statistical data of students' GPA required for some top universities such as UCLA, Asian students need to obtain 4.28 while other ethnicities just need to get 3.7. Such raw data shows an absolutely unfair platform for Asian American students. Moreover, is not fair that SCA 5 will give students who have lower educational achievements more chances to get into the col-

lege than the students who have better educational achievements. Tracing back to the original basics of the American establishment, democracy is meant for every race. SCA5 would add more strains to the "democratic" American educational system. Citizens' anger could spread all over the country and make people argue and fight over this issue, creating some kind of "mental civil war". Thus, it was urgent for government to vote "no" for this policy since it would lead American education to a cliff or a swamp.

Furthermore, many Asian immigrants would abandon their ambitions to serve America. Only Asian-American participants in politics can bring hope to provide more appropriate benefits for Asians in America. Due to the unfair SCA5, Asian students would start to abandon their goals to achieve a perfect GPA in order to go to the top universities. Especially at our school, PCC, many Asians are struggling to be on the top to realize their dreams in the future, but SCA5 could make them frustrated, and they would start to question what they are studying for. Would they be able to accomplish their educational dreams or be ordinary university graduates? Hypothesizing that no more Asians would work for NASA or Silicon Valley, could America go backward to be a less developed country? Therefore, SCA5 is a dangerous blasting fuse to prevent more Asian Americans from working and studying for their fascinating goals.

In conclusion, SCA5 is a bad college admission policy change. SCA 5 encourages American society to go backward to fifty years ago, prior to what Martin Luther King had fought for. Not only would it destroy the future of many capable students in the country who work hard and may never have a chance to be admitted to their dream colleges anymore, but it could also lead to a disturbance among different races. Moreover, it definitely would dissuade numerous Asian students to abandon their goals and dreams. Consequently, we should praise the cancellation of this policy.
