


## Mary and Max

The film *Graduate* is about the university graduate acted by Dustin Hoffman, seduced by an older woman called Mrs. Robinson acted by Anne Bancroft, and eventually he falls in love with her daughter, Elaine. Struggling in their relationship, Elaine leaves Braddock a note saying that "although she loves him, her father's anger would never lead to Braddock's acceptance as Elaine's husband." When he discovers that Elaine is getting married at her own wedding, he tries every means to stop that. At the end of this movie, with no well-defined aim in life, Benjamin Braddock decides to leave the chapel and town.



There are several articles that praise the success of this movie. In the article written by A.D. Murphy, he notes that it is a wonderful screenplay for the Calder Willingham and Buck Henry because it is a successful adaption of Charles Webb novel. He points out that the ending of this movie is outstanding. "Vet cameraman Robert Surtees used Panavision and Technicolor to desired advantage (Murphy 2)." The uses of "new techniques" were made to instantiate the modern look in the movie, and the production designs such as music, the editing, and other technical credits, perfect. The article in New York Times by Bosley Crowther rather focuses on how the story and the performance are highly related. The image of Braddock is successful because it creates a silver-spooned youth graduates from the college and misses the direction in his life (Crowther 2). The latter plot of this movie has extensively shown that Braddock is innocent and confused. He has done so many wrong doings that he suffers from those later. Crowther further points out that the director and the actors surprisingly use cameras to express such a simple story line. "The overall picture has the quality of a very extensive and revealing social scan." In other words, the great qualities of pictures contribute much to the success of the movie. Both articles have highly rated this movie and owe the success to the simple storyline as well as the great production of the movie. I also agree with the articles that the music, the picture, and other technical contributes are just excellent.
